Care Netram team in Jharkhand continues its good work of providing good vision.

Care Netram team reaches out to areas which has limited access to vision care and organizes eye camp to early detect eye problems among village dwellers.

We have conducted 150+ community outreaches in the month of April, 2022.



Community Eye Camps In Rural Schools



Care Netram eye camps go out to rural school children having limited access to vision care. The school children are provided with free eye screening to early detect any eye illness. We distribute affordable eyewear to the needy and cataract surgery free of cost.



Children in rural areas usually suffer from eye problems due to vitamin A deficiency. We recommend them eye care habits to prevent avoidable blindness in the future.

We have completed 800+ free eye screenings in rural schools.



Impacting The Lives Of Indigenous People

A little help can be a ray of sunshine in someone's cloudy world.

About Adivasi's (Indigenous People)

Adivasi, meaning 'first settlers', are Indigenous people. The Adivasis belong to certain tribal societies depending on the area. Their life is strongly influenced by their connection to nature. Most Adivasi's are either farmers or make their living from traditional handicrafts. The 10 million Adivasi who live in cities mostly live in slums - they have lower standard of living and remain below the poverty line.

They do not know any castes and do not believe in reincarnation, women are largely equal and can freely choose their spouse. For the most part, they are not Hindus, but have their own strongly nature-based beliefs. To this day, they fight for recognition by the Indian government.

Adivasi women from Odisha are famous for their decorative tattoos on their faces, which they believe will identify them with their relatives after death. Tattooing is a tradition that is now dying out and can only be found among older Adivasi women.





Our Impact



The 65-year-old says she got the tattoos when she was 14. She lives in Daringbadi village in Kandhamal district, a hilly area six hours drive from the capital, Bhubaneshwar. In this part of Odisha, medical care for the people is meager; ophthalmologists and clinics are scarce.

Sibanti Pradham belongs to the Kondha-Adivasi tribe and lives together with her three sisters and husbands from agriculture and a little handicraft. Among other things, she makes small bowls from leaves, which she sells for a few rupees. But this is exactly what she had more and more difficulties with.

The 65-year-old, like many people in this district, has never had an eye test before. Previously she had difficulty in crafting due to impaired vision. At our eye camp, she bought a pair of reading glasses at affordable price which made her work easier. Now she remains ever grateful to Care Netram team for offering free eye checkups and affordable eye wears.
